General Exclusions

- 1) Economic Sanctions
- 2) War; Military Action
- 3) Terrorism
- Pre-existing Conditions, except as covered under the acute onset of preexisting provision
- 5) Maternity and Newborn Care
- Charges for Routine Physical Examinations and immunizations are excluded from coverage under this insurance
- 7) Charges for any Treatment or supplies that are:
 - (a) not incurred, obtained or received by an Insured Person during the Period of Coverage
 - (b) not presented to the Company for payment by way of a complete Proof of Claim within one hundred eighty (180) days of the date such Charges are incurred
 - (c) not administered or ordered by a Physician
 - (d) not Medically Necessary
 - (e) provided at no cost to the Insured Person or for which the Insured Person is not otherwise liable
 - (f) in excess of Usual, Reasonable, and Customary
 - (g) Related to Hospice Care
 - (h) incurred by an Insured Person who was HIV +, HIV, AIDS virus, AIDS related Illness, ARC Syndrome, AIDS and/or any other Illness arising or resulting from any complications or consequences of any of the foregoing conditions; whether or not the Insured Person had knowledge of his/her HIV status prior to the Effective Date, and whether or not the Charges are incurred in relation to or as a result of said status
 - provided by or at the direction or recommendation of a chiropractor, unless ordered in advance by a Physician
 - (j) performed or provided by a Relative of the Insured Person
 - (k) not expressly included as Eligible Medical Expenses as defined in the ELIGIBLE MEDICAL EXPENSES provision
 - (I) provided by a person who resides or has resided with the Insured Person or in the Insured Person's home
 - (m) required or recommended as a result of complications or consequences arising from or related to any Treatment, Illness, Injury, or supply excluded from coverage or which is otherwise not covered under this insurance
 - (n) for Congenital Disorders and conditions arising out of or resulting there from
- 8) Charges incurred for failure to keep a scheduled appointment
- 9) Charges incurred for Surgeries or Treatment or supplies which are Investigational, Experimental, or for research purposes
- 10) Charges incurred while confined primarily to receive Custodial Care, Educational or Rehabilitative Care
- 11) Charges incurred for any Surgery, Treatment or supplies relating to, arising from or in connection with, for, or as a result of:
 - (a) weight modification, modifications of the physical body or the Treatment of obesity
 - (b) cosmetic or aesthetic reasons, except for reconstructive Surgery when such Surgery is Medically Necessary and is directly related to and follows a Surgery which was covered under this insurance
 - (c) Except as specifically provided for in the SPORTS provision, any Illness or Injury sustained while taking part in, practicing or training for: Hazardous or Extreme sports, Amateur Athletics; Professional Athletics; or athletic activities that are sponsored by any Governing Body or Authority or the International Olympic Committee
 - (d) any Injury or Illness sustained as a result of being under the influence of or due wholly or partly to the effects of alcohol, liquor, intoxicating substance, narcotics or drugs other than drugs taken in accordance with Treatment prescribed and directed by a Physician but not for the Treatment of Substance Abuse
 - (e) any willfully Self-inflicted Injury or Illness
 - (f) any sexually transmitted or venereal disease
 - (g) any testing for the following: HIV, seropositivity to the AIDS virus, AIDS related Illnesses, ARC Syndrome, AIDS
 - (h) any Illness or Injury resulting from or occurring during the commission of a violation of law by the Insured Person, including, without limitation, the engaging in an illegal occupation or act, but excluding minor traffic violations
 - (i) any Substance Abuse
 - speech, vocational, occupational, biofeedback, acupuncture, recreational, sleep or music therapy
 - (k) orthoptics, visual therapy or visual eye training
 - (I) any Illness or Treatment of the feet, including without limitation: orthopedic shoes; orthopedic prescription devices to be attached to or placed in shoes; Treatment of weak, strained, flat, unstable or unbalanced feet; metatarsalgia, bone spurs, hammer toes or bunions; and any Treatment or supplies for corns, calluses or toenails;
 - (m) hair loss, including without limitation wigs, hair transplants or any drug that promises to promote hair growth, whether or not prescribed by a Physician
 - (n) any sleep disorder, including without limitation sleep apnea

- (o) any exercise program and/or equipment, whether or not prescribed or recommended by a Physician
- (p) any exposure to any non-medical nuclear or atomic radiation, and/or radioactive material(s)
- (q) any organ or tissue or other transplant or related services, Treatment or supplies
- (r) any artificial or mechanical devices designed to replace human organs temporarily or permanently after termination of Inpatient status
- (s) any efforts to keep a donor alive for a transplant procedure
- (t) any Illness or Injury incurred in the Destination Country, Affected Area or Country of Residence as a result of a Public Health Emergency of International Concern, Epidemic, Pandemic, other disease outbreak, or Natural Disaster, that may affect an Insured Person's health, unless coverage is expressly provided under the PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY provision of this insurance This exclusion DOES NOT apply to Charges resulting from COVID-19/SARS-CoV-2
- 12) Charges incurred for any Treatment or supply that either promotes or prevents or attempts to promote or prevent conception or birth; including but not limited to: artificial insemination; oral contraceptives, Treatment for infertility or impotency; vasectomy or reversal of vasectomy; sterilization or reversal of sterilization; surrogacy or abortion
- 13) Charges incurred for any Treatment or supply that either promotes, enhances or corrects or attempts to promote, enhance or correct impotency or sexual dysfunction
- 14) Charges incurred for Dental Treatment, except as specifically provided for hereunder
- 15) Charges incurred for eyeglasses, contact lenses, hearing aids, hearing implants and Charges for any Treatment, supply, examination or fitting related to these devices, or for eye refraction for any reason
- 16) Charges incurred for eye Surgery, such as but not limited to radial keratotomy, when the primary purpose is to correct or attempt to correct nearsightedness, farsightedness, or astigmatism
- 17) Charges incurred for Treatment or supplies for temporomandibular joint (TMJ) including but not limited to TMJ syndrome, craniomandibular syndrome, chronic TMJ pain, orthognathic Surgery, Le-Fort Surgery, or splints
- 18) Charges incurred while in the Insured Person's Home Country, except as otherwise expressly provided for hereunder
- Charges incurred for any travel, meals, transportation and/or accommodations, except as otherwise expressly provided for in this insurance
- 20) Charges or expenses incurred for nonprescription drugs, medicines, vitamins, food extracts, or nutritional supplements; IV vitamin or herbal therapy; drugs or medicines not approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration or which are considered "off-label" drug use; and for drugs or medicines not prescribed by a Physician
- 21) Charges and all costs related to or arising from or in connection with all trips to the Host Country undertaken for the purpose of securing medical Treatment or supplies
- 22) Charges for massage therapy
- 23) Charges for Treatment of an Illness or Injury for which payment is made or available through a workers' compensation law or a similar law
- 24) Accidental Death or Dismemberment when the Insured Person's death or dismemberment is caused directly or indirectly by, results from, or where there is a contribution from, any of the following:
 - (a) bodily or mental infirmity, illness or disease
 - (b) infection, other than infection occurring simultaneously with, and as a direct result of, the accidental injury.
